### **Deeper Learning**

We have been doing a lot of thinking recently about how we best prepare our students for the world of the 21<sup>st</sup> century. So much of education has been around for many years, while the world we live in has changed significantly and we are wanting to have a response to this in terms of our curriculum. One of the researchers we have been reading is Professor Michael Fullen who leads teams all over the world (including in NZ) modifying curricula to encompass the skills people will need to be successful in the modern world. He has coined the "6 Cs" as vital concepts to be learning (see below).


We are currently trialling a number of different aspects of project work to empower students in their growth. Some examples include the "Garden to Table" project in D6 where Mr Henderson and his class have a garden growing, all set up by the students, who are also encouraging school composting and making meals with some of the produce. Mrs Sutherland in D1 has students designing all sorts of things on a Friday eg skateboard rinks for Tekdeks and Mrs Bannister has STEAM (integration of Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Music) projects with the New Entrants. They recently made hats to wear in the rain and also a model bridge to carry a large number of elephants. The students are set the challenge, given some resources and then they just go for it and tap into their inner creativity and increase their learning as they face each new problem/difficulty.

In all of these, the students are learning how to work together collaboratively and how to communicate their work to others. It's really quite exciting seeing what the kids come up with and the awesome deep learning that can come out of it. Life and education has moved well past learning

just Math, Reading and Writing.
