Frequently asked questions

- 1 Does my child have to have a digital device?
 - a. No. In years 11 to 13 however, we strongly suggest that students have their own device. Constant access for each senior student is vital.
- 2 Will they be used all the time?
 - b. No, sometimes a whole day may pass without it needing to be used.
- 3 Will it help with homework and other learning tasks?
 - c. Yes, increasingly homework will be assigned online via Office 365.
 - d. Children will have other ongoing learning tasks which they can work on independently at school and at home.
- 4 Who else will use my child's device?
 - e. No one. Children may sometimes undertake shared learning activities.
- 5 Where will my child's device be stored?
 - f. Students will take responsibility for storage and charging of their device.
- 6 What happens if my child's device is lost, stolen or broken?
 - g. Parents need to insure their child's device.
 - h. School cannot be responsible for loss, damage or theft.
 - i. If damage loss or theft involves another student then normal school behaviour management procedures will apply.
 - j. Classrooms will not always be secured when not in use.
