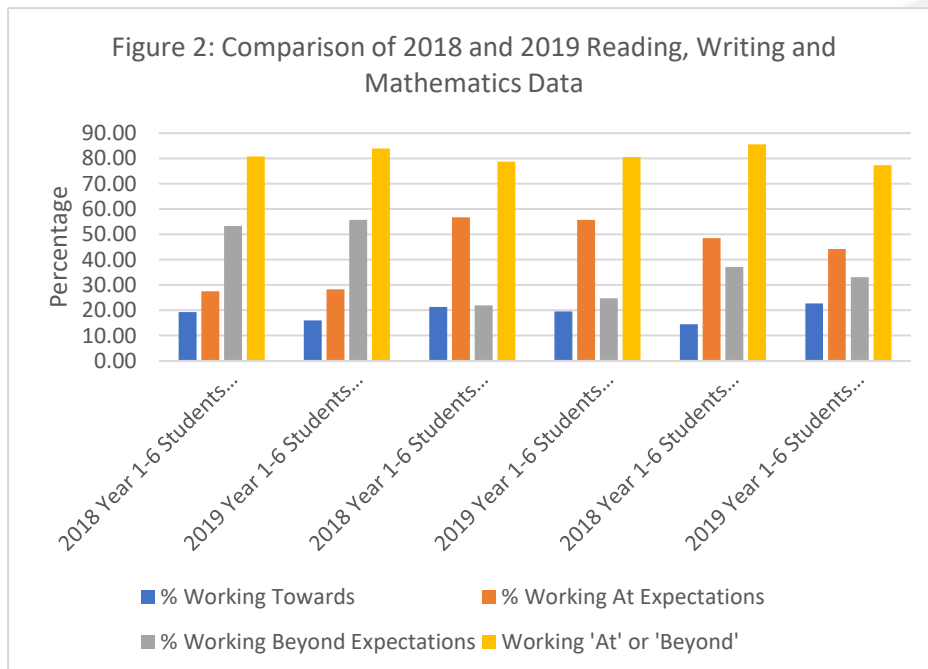
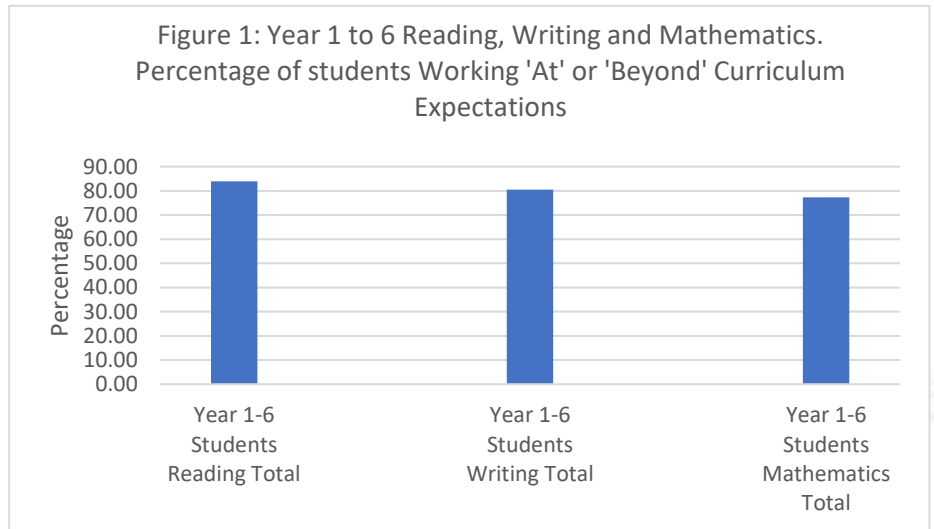


Acting Principal's Message

Dear Parents /Kia ora te whanau/Malo e lelei/Talofa lava/Bula Vinaka/Konnichi wa/Kia orana/Namaste/Welkom/Ni hao,

As promised in the first newsletter of the year, I would like to take a moment to celebrate with our wider school family our academic results for the 2019 school year.

Year 1-6: Figure 1 (right) indicates that we have above 80% of our year 1 to 6 students working at or beyond New Zealand Curriculum expectations in Reading (83%) and Writing (81%). 77% of students in year 1 to 6 are working at or beyond expectations in Mathematics.



In Figure 2 (left), the year 1 to 6 data for Reading, Writing and Maths in 2018 has been compared with our 2019 results. It was good to see significant improvements in our Reading and Writing achievement. As you can also see, there was a drop in our mathematics results between 2018 (85%) and 2019 (77%). We are unsure why this has happened, especially since mathematics was a core area of Professional Development focus in 2019. Maybe our teachers have got better at recognising what the requirements for mathematics looked like at each year level.

Years 7-10: In year 7 and 8, 78% of year 7 students and 79% of year 8 students are working at or above target numeracy expectations, whilst 85% of year 7 students and 79% of year 8 students are working at or above target literacy expectations. In year 9 and 10, 86% of year 9 students and 87% of year 10 students are working at or above target numeracy expectations, whilst 82% of year 9 students and 83% of year 10 students are working at or above target literacy expectations.

Year 11-13: The NZQA data below is based on total roll numbers in a year level. All students are counted in the statistics regardless of whether they are entered and eligible for the qualification. Almost everyone who was enrolled and eligible for NCEA at the respective levels (1, 2 or 3) in 2019 gained their qualification. This is an outstanding achievement. For the most part, the proportion of each year level below who did not get their qualification also represents the proportion of students on alternate pathway courses, or in the case of Year 13, the proportion of students who left school for employment etc before completing Level 3. That said, the graphs below show that we are well above the national and decile averages once again in 2019.

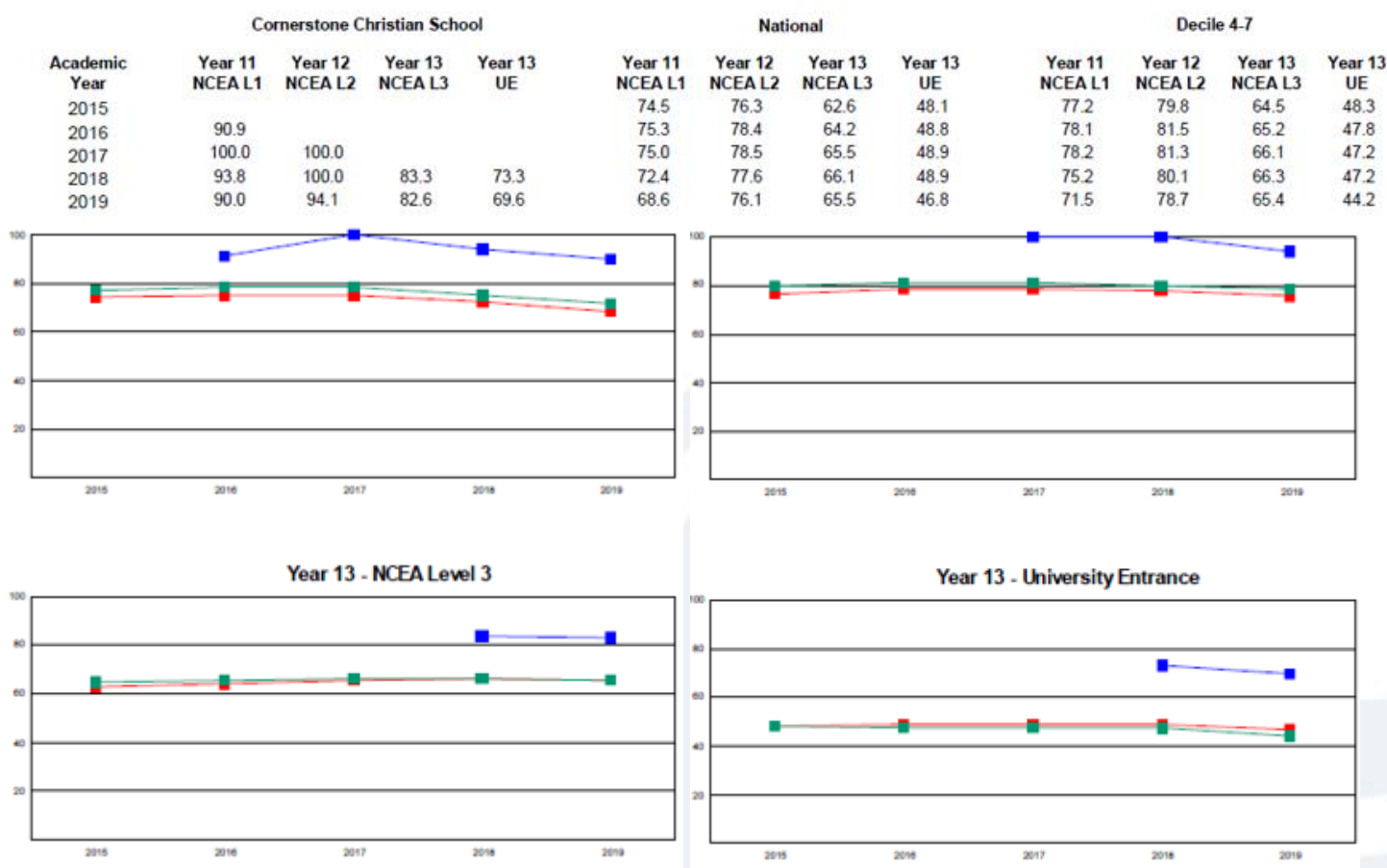


