# The Three R's of Teaching and Learning: Relationship, Relationship, Relationship

#### Ecclesiastes 4:9-10

Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labour. If either of them falls down, one can help the other up.

For most of us who are now parents, when we were at school, our teachers taught us subjects. As students in our classes, we were largely seen as a cohort, a class, and rarely individuals within the system.

When we were seen as individuals, it was to be judged a success, or not, as the case may be. But success itself was based on a very narrow construct. Essentially, our capacity to regurgitate knowledge back to teachers on exam scripts. Schooling, it seemed, was a filter. Simply a way to arrange us for assimilation into the job market.

For us, that model simply doesn't cut it. For us, the mission is different. We don't teach *subjects,* we teach *students*. Our aim is that students learn, serve and *grow in God*. That students leave school ready and able to creatively impact our world for Christ.

In fact, we view our students as the emerging hands and feet of Christ, who should be connected and able to discern the needs of others and be equipped to rise up to meet those needs.

As a result, our discipleship programmes are designed to encourage meaningful, connected relationships. Both student to student within their classes, but also between students and teachers, and teachers and parents. We ask our teachers to invest in these spaces on a personal level, to become relevant in the lives of our young people. Approachable, available, ready and able to disciple through shared experiences and personal testimony. I thank our staff for doing this. They don't have to professionally, but I thank God they feel called to spiritually.

This week I would particularly like to thank all the teachers and parents who journeyed with the Year 6 students on camp. As the parent of one student at camp, I thank everyone for the personal sacrifices they made to make this happen. The leave from work that parents took to be a camp helper, the sacrifice of family time that teachers gave to stay away from home and run the camp.

What an awesome community God has blessed us with.

She will be screening New Entrants who have not had/completed their B4 School Check, selected Year 7 and 8 students – retests/follow-ups/absentees or those that have not been screened as a Year 7 or 8 and children that have no previous screening record.

#### Year 7 & 8 Immunisations

The Ministry of Health School Based Immunisation Programmes will again be offered by Public Health in 2020. Parent consent forms have gone home to Year 7 and 8 students for the below immunisation/vaccine. All consent forms should have been completed and returned to your child's teacher. If you have not returned your Year 7 or 8 child's immunisation/vaccination form, please return this to the school office ASAP. Even if you do not want your child to have the Immunisation/Vaccination, please fill out the DO NOT CONSENT part of the form.

<u>Year 7 Immunisation</u>: Boostrix – a booster to help protect against infection from tetanus, diphtheria and whooping cough (pertussis). To be given on 8<sup>th</sup> May 2020.

<u>Year 8 HPV Vaccination</u>: Human Papillomavirus Vaccine - Dose 1: 8<sup>th</sup> May 2020, Dose 2: 5<sup>th</sup> November 2020.

#### **New PE Uniform**

From Term 2 (Tuesday 28 April) we will be introducing our new PE/sports uniform for students in Years 7-10. This uniform will be used for Physical Education lessons and will also be used as the uniform for those playing in junior school sports teams (Years 7-10). There is a boys' cut (pictured right) and a girls' cut (pictured below). The shorts come in two designs, unisex or girls. Girls have the choice of wearing the unisex option or the girl's shorts.





Students that have an existing school PE uniform, will not have to purchase a new one, unless they are playing in a Year 7–10 (Junior) school sports team, as uniforms for these teams will no longer be issued. In this instance, they will need to purchase a new top to wear as their uniform for their sports team, although they may continue to wear the existing blue shorts if they have them.

The sizing charts will be emailed again with this newsletter and will also be sent via the school app. There are also paper copies available from the school reception.

**Please measure your child at home and choose the shirt and shorts as per the sizing chart.** These are from a different supplier than the old PE uniform, so sizing may differ. The cost of the t-shirt is \$40 and the shorts are \$40. Orders need to be placed by Friday 13<sup>th</sup> March (Week 6) by emailing <u>ilona@cornerstone.ac.nz</u> or by delivering your child's size chart to Ilona Shewell in the school office with your child's name, classroom and size on it. Payment needs to be made at the time of ordering please. As these shirts are being manufactured specifically for us, there will be a wait time of approximately 6-8 weeks before they will be available to collect.


