Deputy Principal's Message

Dear Parents /Kia ora te whanau/Malo e lelei/Talofa lava/Bula Vinaka/Konnichi wa/Kia orana/ Namaste/Welkom/Ni hao,

Years ago, as a young adult, I spent six years attending and then working at a Bible College, north of Auckland. As part of our outreach service at Bible College, I worked as a 'roadie' for musicians, David and Dale Garrett who pioneered 'Scripture in Song' worldwide. Many of us who are slightly longer in the tooth can probably remember the old brown and blue spiral-bound Scripture in Song music books that used to be used as the go-to for worship teams within churches in New Zealand. In the latter years of Scripture in Song, David and Dale along with their band members, deliberately wrote songs that promoted the memorisation of scripture – and I am forever grateful for these. One of their songs has been playing on repeat in my head this week. It was based on the scripture 2 Timothy 1:7 – 'God has not, given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.'

This week we have been bombarded at every turn with news and advice, and to an extent scaremongering, around the Covid-19 virus. It is easy for adults and children alike to fall into fear and anxiety around this untested threat to our country. In this season, we need to remind ourselves that God is still on the throne and that He still holds the universe in His capable hands, and that the Holy Spirit within us gives us power to overcome, and the ability to have a sound mind. This is not a time for panic, it is a time for sound, reasoned thinking, enabled by the Holy Spirit.

A quote I read this week states 'fear is magnified and distorted caution'. To be cautious is fine, but as we know this can easily be distorted as our thoughts cycle through everything bad that could possibly happen!

With all of this in mind, the school management team have felt that it is both wise and prudent to put in place a range of measures at Cornerstone Christian School to ensure that Cornerstone remains a safe place for all students and to ensure that we are 'loving our neighbour' by reducing the likelihood of infection amongst our wider school community.

As indicated in an email sent out on Wednesday this week, these measures include:

- Increasing student education around the importance of effective hygiene practices:
 - \circ Wash hands after using the bathroom and before eating.
 - o Basic hygiene.
 - Avoid person to person contact, this includes handshakes, hugs and hongi where possible.
 - Sneeze into your elbow and wash hands afterwards.
- Ensuring the contact details for all school families are <u>totally up to date</u>. To this end Jean in the office will be sending out a contact info update sheet from our School Management system (KAMAR). Please ensure the details on this sheet are totally correct. If not, please make corrections and hand these into the school office.

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- Delaying, cancelling or postponing EOTC (Education Outside The Classroom) or learning activities outside of Palmerston North. At the time of writing these include:
 - World Vision Leadership Conference in Wellington - Cancelled
 - The NZACS year 4-8 sports day on Friday – Postponed
 - Manawatu Inter-Secondary School Athletics – Cancelled
 - Summer Volleyball Tournament
 Cancelled



- Netball, Hockey and Volleyball Competitions postponed until term 2 (most schoolbased practises though are still happening).
- Year 7 and 8 Leadership Camp Postponed until later in the year.
- Actively encouraging anyone from our school community to remain home if unwell.
- Reviewing, postponing or cancelling any domestic or international school-related travel by students and staff on a case by case basis.
- Supporting students learning through online tools, should they be required to self-isolate. If
 your secondary child uses a school provided laptop, please contact the school to arrange
 access to a device. Email: paul@cornerstone.ac.nz.
- Keeping our community updated with any advice we are receiving from the Ministry of Health and or Education.
- As a precautionary measure we will be turning off the shared drinking fountains this week. We encourage students to bring their own drink bottles.
