<u>Year 8 HPV Vaccination</u>: Human Papillomavirus Vaccine - Dose 1: 8th May 2020, Dose 2: 5th November 2020.

Any parent/guardian that does not wish their child to be checked, could they please inform the school office. Thank you.


Student Drop off / Pick up Times

New PE Uniform

From Term 2 (Tuesday 28 April) we will be introducing our new PE/sports uniform for students in Years 7-10.

This uniform will be used for Physical Education lessons and will also be used as the uniform for those playing in junior school sports teams (Years 7-10). There is a boys' cut (pictured right) and a girls' cut (pictured below). The shorts come in two designs, unisex or girls. Girls have the choice of wearing the unisex option or the girl's shorts.

Students that have an existing school PE uniform, will not have to purchase a new one, unless they are playing in a Year 7–10 (Junior) school sports team, as uniforms for these teams will no longer be issued. In this instance,





they will need to purchase a new top to wear as their uniform for their sports team, although they may continue to wear the existing blue shorts if they have them.

These are from a different supplier than the old PE uniform, so sizing may differ. The cost of the t-shirt is \$40 and the shorts are \$40. Orders need to be placed by Friday 13th March (Week 6) by emailing ilona@cornerstone.ac.nz Payment needs to be made at the time of ordering please.

As these shirts are being manufactured specifically for us, there will be a wait time of approximately 6-8 weeks before they will be available to collect.
