Something to Think About

Last night at our Board meeting the Chairman of the Board of Proprietors, Mr Richard Tankersley, shared Psalm 42 for our meeting devotion. Listening to Richard read the Psalm out loud, I was struck anew just how much the Psalms are filled with raw and at times gut-wrenching human emotion. Reading our way through the Psalms we see in the lives of Kind David's contemporaries, every single kind of emotion from over-the-top joy, though to the depths of despair. The Psalms invite us to see ourselves through Scripture as our feelings and emotions are mirrored by those struggling to be faithful to God. Seeing our emotions mirrored in the Psalms, invites us to get real with God. We begin to gain a sense of confidence in God as we allow Him to enter our raw feelings about life. This is particularly important in this crazy COVID year! As God enters our hearts through His Spirit, our hearts become God's sanctuary. Paul writes, "Do you not know that you are a temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" (1 Corinthians 3:16.) Inviting God to expand His presence in us, through His Spirit as we mediate on His word, enables us to sort out our feelings about life. Our hearts become God's sanctuary and in giving Him a sanctuary, he becomes our refuge.

Please stay safe over the next two weeks and I sincerely look forward to seeing you all back at school on Monday 12th October.
