Principal's Message

Dear Parents/Kia ora te whanau/Malo e lelei/Talofa lava/Bula Vinaka/Konnichi wa/Kia orana/ Namaste/Welkom/Ni hao,

It's hard to believe that this week is the last full week for our year 11 to 13 students. Next week on Wednesday our year 11 to 13's head away on study leave to prepare for their upcoming NCEA external examinations.

The overall shortening of face-to-face learning time here at school due to COVID lockdown earlier this year has presented some challenges for our senior students around achieving the required credits to gain NCEA 1, 2 or 3. Can I please ask that all Cornerstone families keep our senior students in their prayers, as they prepare for external examinations. A small number of students will be returning to school later in term 4 to complete 'Summer School' – additional classes that allow space for students to gain or finish credits to 'get over the line'. Thank you to our Senior Assistant Principal, Mrs Natasha Casey and Mr Carl McIntyre for making these classes available to our students.





Book Week

Last week was a fun-filled week here at Cornerstone, as the school immersed themselves in the wonders of books and reading for enjoyment. The week culminated with a 'book character parade', and I was so heartened to see most students and teachers get into the spirit of the day. We had everyone from Bilbo Baggins through to the Cat in the Hat – and that was just the teachers! (Thanks, Mr McDonald and Mrs Little).

Over the course of the week, book sales were held in the school library. These were well attended by our school community and we managed to raise just over \$3,000 to spend on more resources to go back into our library space. Again, a huge thank you to our librarian, Mrs Katharine Bracey, teacher in charge of library, Mrs Raeleen Simpson and parent Mrs Tracey Knowlton for all of your efforts across this week.

Careers Expo

On the same day as our book parade, Mr Carl McIntyre organized a fantastic careers expo for all of our secondary students here at school. Walking around the gym and secondary area, I was amazed

by the range of professions represented; lawyers, firemen, Midcentral DHB, ER doctors, Police, Insurance specialists, tree arborists, UCOL trades, Fonterra, the Military, Beauticians, to name but a few, were all in attendance! A huge thank you to Mr McIntyre for organizing this event so well and for arranging such a wide and diverse range of career opportunities for our students to consider.



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Timetable Changes for 2020

I would like to signal to our school community that we will be making some slight changes to our school timetable in 2021 in order to comply with Employment Relations law and also our Union Collective Agreement. The <u>whole school</u> will start next year at 9.00am and finish at 3.00pm. Break times will be very similar to those existing. The core change is that secondary students will have a two week rotation in their timetable rather than the current five day timetable. We will ensure that all secondary students are well informed of their timetables prior to school starting on February 1, 2021.

Camps are a core part of the Cornerstone Christian School learning experience and are often significant moments of 'God encounter' for all of our students. Again, could we please ask that our Cornerstone families keep these camps in their prayers – asking for God's covering and presence over these camps.

A huge thank you also goes out to all of the Mums and Dads who have put up their hand to help with these events.

Behaviour

This week has been a difficult week for our school around behaviour. We had a significant incident in year 7 at the start of the week that placed a number of our students at risk. I am thankful to our incredible staff who teamed together to speedily diffuse this situation.

In these final weeks before the end of the year, can I please ask that all of our Cornerstone family (Students, Parents and Teachers alike) act with kindness – remembering that Jesus asks us to treat others as we would want to be treated, and secondly to exercise patience. This year has been 'extraordinary' in the true sense of that word and many of our students are tired and perhaps anxious.

Recognising this, let us remember to always conduct ourselves in a Godly manner. In the book of Galatians in the Bible, the writer describes the kind of character we each will exhibit as we let God shape and mould us:

Galatians 5:22: "But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things!"

All teachers will be centrally located in G1/G2. Student attendance is optional. If parents prefer to attend the subject interview on their own, they may do so.

- a. 10 minutes per interview. If your student has the same teacher for two subjects eg, Maths/Humanities, you may book two 10-minute slots.
- b. Again, Parents can book to see several subject teachers, as you require.
- c. Interviews to be held after school between 3:30pm-6:30pm on Tuesday 10 November and Wednesday 11 November.
- d. School WILL NOT finish early on these days.

- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions to book a subject interview for each subject as needed

School Blazers – Year 11-13's

Blazers mark the transition from Middle School (Year 7-10) to Senior School (Year 11-13). Students are classed as senior students when they enter Year 11. Rather than waiting until Year 13 to purchase school blazers, we suggest that parents purchase these for use in Years 11-13. By purchasing a blazer in Year 11, students get three years' wear out of it, before it is on-sold at the end of Year 13. Order forms will be available at the Student Administration Office desk and fittings will start in Week 4, Monday 2nd November afterschool in the Student Administration Office.

A non-refundable deposit of \$120 must be made with each blazer order. Please include the deposit with the order form. The balance of \$110 will go on your student's school account and must be paid at the time the blazer is collected in Term 1, 2021.

Some assistance funding is available for families in need. If you wish to apply for this funding, please email the Deputy Principal <u>james@cornerstone.ac.nz</u>. All orders need to be made by Friday 20th November (Week 6).


