Like-wise this term we want to encourage students to act with kindness and care towards each other. One recent student-led initiative that I love is our 'kindness



bench' (see photo). This bench was the idea of our junior school council (in particular Annabelle McDonald, Shanti Batchelor and Jada-Rose Vilivili) who wanted a place for students to sit who were feeling sad or were feeling like they didn't have anyone to play with. It is our hope that when our Cornerstone students see someone sitting on this bench, they actively go and show kindness toward the student(s) sitting there.

We have quite a number of events coming up this term: Friday of week three is the last day for students in years 11-13 as they leave school to go on exam leave prior to their NCEA 1,2 and 3 exams. We will celebrate that Friday (1st November) by

holding our annual Cultures Day – a day of colour, fun and food as we celebrate the diversity of cultures we have represented at school. On that note we really need some dance, music or other cultural items. Parents, can you please really try to encourage your children to put an item together – or get involved yourself!
