Principal's Message

Dear Parents/Kia ora te whanau/Malo e lelei/Talofa lava/Bula Vinaka/Konnichi wa/Kia orana/Namaste/Welkom/Ni hao,

As I watch the TV news and read online the daily COVID updates, it is very hard at the moment, not to be caught up in a crazy tide of negativity, fear, and depression. I was thankful this week that God in His great grace led me to a Bible verse that shook me out of this mindset. Romans 12:21 tells us, "Don't let evil conquer you, but conquer evil by doing good." God does not want us to live in a state of being overcome by what is happening around us. God calls us to take action as Christians to do something completely different - to move in the "opposite spirit" to the world around us. It doesn't mean that we should be like ostriches and bury our heads in the sand – but we do not need to accept as OUR truth the daily dose of disaster and doom fed to us by the media.

By moving in the opposite spirit, we choose to walk in faith, not fear; we choose to walk in victory, not defeat; in generosity not greed; in peace, not anxiety; in love, not anger; in integrity, not dishonesty; in joy, not in depression. We serve instead of wanting to lead, and we give instead of wanting to receive. We bring light into darkness, and righteousness into places where there is none.

A few years ago, a worldwide movement started called, Random Acts of Kindness day (see rak.co.nz). This year Random Acts of Kindness Day here in New Zealand is September 1st, 2020, and you can be sure that we will be getting on board with this as a school (see: www.rak.co.nz).

Here are some of the ideas we will be encouraging our students to participate in. Equally, these may be things that our Cornerstone families could participate in to 'walk in the opposite spirit':

- Ask your teacher if you can clean up around the school, ask another class to join your efforts.
- Eat lunch with someone who is new or sitting alone or invite him or her to your table.
- Talk to a student you've never talked to before.
- Organise your whole class to bring flowers or chocolates to school to surprise your teacher!
- Bake a cake or biscuits for another class/take home to parents/office staff.
- Make cards or notes for people you appreciate around your school, i.e caretaker/teachers/teacher aides/office staff/friends.
- Give some flowers or make some origami flowers to give to someone.
- Make soup or hot drinks and a stall and give them out before school/morning tea or lunch.
- Go to a retirement home and sing to the elderly.
- Organise a shared lunch with another class or group of friends.

This sounds like a whole lot of fun and I am looking forward to September 1st here at school!



Enrolment Scheme

Cornerstone Christian School's enrolment scheme has been approved by the Secretary for Education. This has important consequences for the way in which applications for enrolment are processed and places offered. It also increases transparency around our enrolment processes and our waiting list.

The enrolment scheme contains key information around the new procedures and may be downloaded from our website http://www.cornerstone.ac.nz/enrolment-scheme/ or picked up from reception. From mid/late October, a copy of the waiting list will be held at reception.

Each year the enrolment scheme requires the Board of Trustees to advertise the likely number of places available at the school for the following year, and to have a cut-off date by which applications must be received.

The cut-off date for 2021 enrolment applications is likely to be Monday 12th October (this will be confirmed once the Ministry of Education has informed us of the outcome of our maximum roll increase application in September).

After the cut-off date, the applicants for places at each year level will be ranked in order (in line with the zones and priorities in the enrolment scheme) and parents/caregivers will be informed:

EITHER:

• That their child has been offered a place at Cornerstone in 2021. Parents/caregivers will need to accept or reject the place in writing within 14 days. If they reject the place or fail to respond, the place will be offered to the first child on the waiting list for that year level.

OR

Of their child's place on the waiting list for that year level.

Sports Notices – School App

If you haven't done so already, please consider putting the School App on your cell phone. This is the first point of contact we use for all sports cancellations, changes, and information. In this current environment we are using the School App much more frequently to get notices to our community.

To get the Cornerstone School App on your phone, search 'School Apps NZ' on your phone's App store (both Apple App Store and Android's Google Play Store) and download the App to your device. Once downloaded, search for Cornerstone Christian School and follow the setup instructions on your phone's screen.

The School App allows parents to have instant access to important school information like the school calendar, student absences, sports information, school newsletter and so on.

The App also provides instant alerts for parents e.g. the delayed arrival time of a school trip or sports practise cancellations.




Can we please remind parents that it is important that they ensure they have phone notifications for the School App turned on and that they are subscribed to the correct Alert Groups.
