Hanna:

I started the planning 8 months ago, simply beginning by a casual conversation about how great the need is around breaking down educational and cultural barriers in society. Those barriers being identified as the non-unity and understanding between both kiwi and refugee cultures. That sparked my interest, and I had a strong desire to turn my words of change into real action. I then contacted Dr Maria Au Young who has connections with the Afghani community, and after figuring out the logistics, including transportation, snacks, and cultural training, we had our first session on Thursday 25th March 2021.

Within that one single hour of tutoring, we were changing lives as school students. At the first session I saw our CCS students loving their neighbour as themselves, I saw their kindness, willingness to help and their want for change. It was and is an honour to be serving alongside such incredible students!

The sessions run on Thursdays from 3:45pm-4:45pm in G1 and G2 as the Afghani Students (boys and girls) need to be picked up and brought here to CCS, where we have separate rooms to respect their culture of boys and girls not mixing. I was also privileged to be invited to the Palmerston North Afghan Society's AGM and New Year's Eve celebration in March. Their warmth and kindness encouraged me so much.

I cannot wait to see how God will use this opportunity to change lives and use all of these people to change the world.
