Our emphasis will be first and foremost on 'accentuating the positive,' through rewarding student behavior that supports our school values of Respect, Integrity, Diligence, Kindness and Humility before God. Our staff have developed these values into a schoolwide behavior matrix, so that we have consistency in our school wide expectations of behavior within all of the different classes, spaces and year levels at Cornerstone Christian School. We will also be bringing back lunchtime detentions in Week 3. Please be assured that these will always be applied as a natural consequence to poor behavior choices and directed at the process of undoing harm and restoration, not punishment for punishment's sake!

Health Consultation

Section 60B of the Education Act 1989, as amended by the Education Standards Act 2001, outlines the legal requirements for State schools regarding the delivery of the health education components of the relevant National Curriculum statements.

At least once every two years, boards of trustees are required to produce a written statement about how the school will implement health education. The legislation requires schools to:

- Inform the school community about the content of the health education components of the curriculum;
- Consult with members of the school community regarding the way in which the school should implement health education;
- Describe, in broad terms, the health education needs of the school's students.

A second survey will also be shortly sent out to all school families, asking for feedback on these matters.

It is important that we hear parent voice around 'how', 'when' and 'what' should be taught to our students around the following key areas of learning: Mental health, sexuality education, food and nutrition, body care and physical safety, physical activity, sports studies and outdoor education.

Well Done Maui


