Principal's Message

Dear Parents/Kia ora te whanau/Malo e lelei/Talofa lava/Bula Vinaka/Konnichi wa/Kia orana/ Namaste/Welkom/Ni hao,

The newsletter is going to be a bit of a smorgasbord this week, with lots of little bits and pieces I need to let you know about, that are happening here at Cornerstone Christian School. Please bear with me and I will try and keep this as short as possible!

School Production

We are currently two weeks out from our first School Production since we last put on 'The Amazing Race' back in 2016 at Life Church. This year,



Mr Michael Doody is directing the stage production of 'Esther' based on the Old Testament Bible story. Esther (played by Year 13 student Mollie Auer) was the beautiful Jewish wife of the Persian King Ahasuerus (I have no idea how you pronounce that). She and her cousin Mordecai persuade the King to retract an order that demanded that all of the Jewish people across the empire be slaughtered. The massacre is plotted by the King's Chief Minister, Haman, and the date decided by casting lots or 'Purim'. Due to Esther's courageous intervention, Haman instead is hung on the same gallows he built for Mordecai and, on the day planned for their annihilation, the Jews instead destroyed their enemies. A tragic tale yes, but also one that celebrates the moral courage of a young Godly woman.

The dates for the production are Wednesday 7 July and Thursday 8 July, 6.30pm at the Wallace Theatre on Centennial Drive, Palmerston North. We would love it if all of our school family (and relatives) can attend and celebrate the huge effort students and teachers have put into this event.

Mihaere Drive Crossing

On Monday of Week 9 (next week), the KEA crossing (road patrol) will begin operating on Mihaere Drive, immediately outside the school gym. Thank you Mr Henderson for organising this. This service will operate from 8.25am–9.00am and 2.55pm–3.15pm, Monday to Friday.

Can we please ask that when this service is operating, students and parents cross **only** at this safe location on Mihaere Drive.

This applies to:

- 1. Parents who park on the East side of Mihaere Drive and walk across Mihaere Drive to pick up their children from school.
- 2. Students who live North East of Cornerstone Christian School and normally walk up Roberts Line, or from Eastern Kelvin Grove area to get to school.
- 3. Students who walk across Mihaere Drive to catch the public bus service on the East side of the road (or on Roberts Line).

Year 7-13 Parent Teacher Subject Interviews

Last year we had feedback from Year 7 to 13 parents that they wanted an opportunity to meet with their children's subject encoded int teachers, not just their LifeLab encodes. In response to this request

we have set up specialist subject interviews on Wednesday 30 June and Thursday 1 July from 3.30pm to 8.00pm. All Year 7 to 13 parents should have received an email with online booking details for these interviews. Ministry of Education Voluntary Donations Scheme

The Voluntary Donations Scheme, is a Ministry of Education initiative, for all state and state-integrated schools, decile 7 and below. Schools are able to choose to receive a \$150 per student, per year payment, if they agree not to ask parents and caregivers for donations. As most parents know we now no longer ask parents for school fees/donations/camp fees and over the past two years we have used the \$150 we receive from the government to fund camps and other Education Outside the Classroom (EOTC) events. The school is required to opt in or out of this scheme on a yearly basis. At a meeting this week, the board voted to opt back into this scheme for 2022, and on this basis, we will continue not to ask parents for camp fees or any other school fees/donations next year.

Please note, this is a completely separate matter to the School Attendance Dues that are paid to the Cornerstone Christian Education Trust (CCET), by all school parents each year. Feel free to email me (principal@cornerstone.ac.nz) if you would like to comment on this decision.


