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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents/Kia ora te whanau/Malo e lelei/Talofa lava/Bula Vinaka/Konnichi wa/Kia orana/ Namaste/Welkom/Ni hao,

Welcome back to Term 4! It was great to stand at the gate on Monday morning and welcome back all of our lovely children and young people.

This week's newsletter is a bit of a smorgasbord of lots of bits and pieces that I need to let you know about, so here goes:



Construction Works

A huge thank you to our Board of Proprietors for completing some needed maintenance works across the school in the last holidays. These include:

- Carpet replacement in Rooms A1, A2, A2+, D2, C2, C4 and C6
- Veranda clear-light replacement on Blocks C and D
- Fluro light replacement with no-flicker LED's in Rooms L3, L4 and L5
- Pathway and drainage from H block to Gym
- Running track and pathway from the gymnasium to L block at the far end of the field.

We are also excited about the start of I block as soon as the building consent comes through from PNCC.

Volunteers Needed

We are on the lookout for parents or volunteers who could help us out with driving a van of high school students to and from offsite Food Technology at Wholegrain Organics, and Wood Technology at Manawatu Woodworkers Guild. This occurs on Mondays and Wednesdays during term time with drop-offs occurring around 11am and pickups at 1:30pm and 3pm. If you hold a current drivers license, are happy to be police vetted, and have some time up your sleeve, I would love to hear from you please. Please email <u>chris@cornerstone.ac.nz</u>. Currently this job is being done by our groundsman Stu Te Mataki. Stu is struggling to get to all of the grounds work that is needed doing across our school site, due to this driving commitment. Alternatively, if you could give some time to weeding, spraying, weed-eating instead, this would also be gratefully received! Thank you.

Hats

In Terms 1 and 4 all students in Years 1-6 are required to wear the school blue bucket hat while they are outside. If they are not wearing a hat they will be directed to play in the shade. 'No hat, no play'. If your child does not have a hat ready for Term 4, please see Mrs Ilona Shewell at the Student Administration desk to purchase one of these.

Students in Years 7-10 are encouraged to wear the school cap while they are outside. These are also available from the Student Administration dock in the school office. In Term 4, Year 6 students maying

to Year 7 in 2022, may also purchase and wear the school cap.

Mandatory Vaccinations

The Government announced on Monday 11th October, that it would be mandatory for all Education Sector staff, volunteers and contractors to be single vaccinated by 15th November 2021 and double vaccinated by 1st January 2022. We are currently trying to wade our way through what this will mean for us as a school. At this stage, the official Health Order has not been released by the Government and until that happens I am not going to jump to any conclusions, or make rash decisions around staff. Please note that there is no requirement for parents coming onsite to be fully vaccinated. While vaccination is of course recommended by the Ministry of Health, we are only asking at this stage that parents avoid coming onsite and if you do need to do so, please wear a mask – much the same as you would have to do if you were visiting Countdown over the road.

End of Year Prize-givings

We are currently seeking clarification around the impact of COVID-19 on the end of year prize-givings. While rules around gathering size under Alert Level 2 do not apply to school, our understanding of current Health Guidelines is that as soon as school parents come onsite, the rules around 100 maximum people apply. Advice we have taken from the Ministry of Education would suggest that this would mean that we are not able to run an End of Year Celebration/Prize-giving with parents in attendance, which to be honest is pretty unpalatable for me. In the absence of further guidance, or an Alert Level change, we are assuming that this year's End of Year Celebrations/Prize-giving's will need to be student only events, with video of the event live-streamed. We are now planning to hold the Secondary (Year 7-13) prize-giving on Monday 13th December at 1pm and the Primary (Year 1-6) end of year celebration on Tuesday 14th December at 1pm. I will keep in touch with parents if there is any change to this situation.

Start Date 2022 and Teacher Only Days

We have had some difficulties putting together the 2022 School Calendar - especially with respect to meeting the requirement to be open for 380 half days. Part of the reason for this, is that there are five teacher only days scheduled for 2022! Four of these are mandated by the Education Unions as part of the last contract round and are therefore non-negotiable. The fifth Teacher Only day is the one that we are taking on Friday 1st April to meet with all of the Christian Schools across the lower North Island.

As a consequence, the 2022 school year will start on Friday 4th February. As this is just prior to Waitangi weekend, the first school day will be shortened. The day will start with a Powhiri to welcome all new students and staff and will conclude at 1.30pm with a 'meet the teacher' lunch and sausage sizzle.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club is back up and running again on Tuesday and Thursday mornings at 8:30am. We have a bigger team in place assisting us with this programme this Term. This includes a Team from Arise Care (led by past Cornerstone student Destiny Pereka).

I would like to acknowledge the hard work of the following people that have put in so much time and effort in Term's 1, 2 and 3 to make Breakfast Club happen: Mr Hayden Hewitt (Teacher), Mrs Eloise Short (Parent) and students Emily Smith, Harrison Rose and Ruby Hewitt.

Phew that was a marathon.
