PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE


Dear Parents, Caregivers and Whānau,

It was so good to have all of our year groups back for on-site learning on Wednesday this week. The school felt very busy and full of life – like every school should be.

Here's an awesome picture of 7CMD students enjoying the spoils of their in-class food technology this week.



We are continuing to see a tapering off of reported COVID cases across all the year levels (see graph below). The whole school is represented by the darker blue line where the percentage of cases in each cohort (and the whole school) has been graphed for each school week this year.



Our attendance is also heading back towards the norm of 90+% on any given day. While I am being realistic and know that COVID will continue to impact our school throughout term two, there is a definite sense that we have turned a corner. The removal of vaccine passes has opened up access to sport for all students and we will look forward to a future drop to the orange traffic light setting so that we can get back to singing, assemblies and schoolwide events.

Site Works

This week our school has been busy with the comings and goings of a large number of contractors. The week did not start well when we discovered a blockage in the sewer main that services all the high school toilets. Initially there was some finger-pointing and some sad toilet humour flying around as we tried to work out who was responsible for this disaster, however on closer inspection we discovered

that the whole sewer pipeline had collapsed near the vicinity of the manhole on Mihaere Drive. This resulted in some serious excavation work to fix. A huge thank you to Brian Donnelly Plumbing and PNCC for their speedy action to fix this issue. Isles Construction have also made some great progress on the I block build this week with all of the steelwork complete, the first floor concrete slabs in place and the ground floor concrete slab poured.

Fixed Term, Part time Teaching Position


Secondary students waiting after school




