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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Whānau,

This week seems to have gone by in a blur! Please remember that on Friday 3rd June (tomorrow) we have a Teachers Only Day and the school will be closed for instruction. This is to allow teachers here at school to spend time upskilling in a variety of areas including the nationwide Secondary NCEA review, growing our understanding of how to integrate a Christian Worldview into secondary subject classes, and the development of structured literacy learning in our Primary School. Enjoy having a long weekend, although the weather forecast does not appear to be too conducive to getting away and sitting on a beach somewhere!



Secondary School

A few parents have expressed concerns of late around our secondary space – particularly around losing our superb commerce teacher at the end of this term and the loss of access to FoodTech at WholeGrain Organics in recent weeks. I would like to take a moment to allay some of these fears. While yes, our lovely Mrs Wucherpfennig is utterly irreplaceable, I can confirm that we have had some excellent applicants for the Commerce, Accounting and Economics position and the appointment panel is meeting tonight to interview and hopefully appoint Mrs Wucherpfennig's replacement. I will let you know the outcome of this as soon as possible. I can also state that I have been working hard alongside our board of trustees to try and find a workaround for the FoodTech and Hospitality programmes that were affected by WholeGrain Organics going into voluntary insolvency. We have a little bit more work to do around this space, but I am confident to say that we do appear to have found a way for these programmes to continue onsite at the WholeGrain kitchen in Broadway Ave, at least until the end of the year. This programme will continue to be taught by Naomi Hall, Gosia Wiatr and Aneta Reuter.

Yes, change is unsettling, however our school is privileged to have one of the most stable staff teams of any school that I know.

COVID - Staff Affected

Over the last two weeks, we have had a number of our staff members contract COVID-19. This has meant that classes have been extremely hard to staff and on two occasions this past week I almost

Pink Shirt Day and Saying 'No' to bullying

Our student leaders have asked to hold a pink shirt day here at school. While our school <u>does not</u> agree with all the aims of the global pink shirt movement, it <u>does</u> agree with the organisation's broader aims around creating a community where all people feel safe, valued and respected. One of the core aims of the movement is to 'Say No to bullying' and this is a core area of focus for us as a school. Like every school in New Zealand yes, our school does have a bullying problem. To say we don't is to hide our head in the sand. To this end our student leaders are inviting all students to either wear a pink shirt or a colourful shirt on Friday 17th June. The student leaders will be running a number of activities across the day to encourage inclusion and to help students say a firm 'NO' to any kind of bullying at Cornerstone Christian School.

While on the topic of bullying, it is worth saying that 'Bullying' is a word sometimes used to describe a lot of things that are not actually bullying. Sometimes at school, students have disagreements or may get upset due to a friendship falling out. This is a normal part of life and working through these issues

act, or isolated incident of aggression are not bullying too. The Ministry of Education defines bullying as:

- Bullying is deliberate harming another person intentionally.
- Bullying involves a misuse of power in relationships there is real or perceived imbalance that may be based on physical size, age, gender, social status, or digital capability and access.
- Bullying is usually not a one-off but is repeated or has the potential to be repeated over time. It is
 when one student (or group of students) keep picking on another student again and again to
 make them feel bad.
- Bullying involves behaviour that can be harmful it is not a normal part of growing up.

If this is happening to your child at school, we need to know, so that it can be sorted out. It is not ok, especially at our Christian School, for this to happen. In the first instance, please contact your child's classroom teacher or LifeLab coach if you believe this is going on. If they are unable to sort it out, we will then move the issue up to other school leaders to address.
