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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Whānau,

This week I have been reading and praying through the Psalms. There is something very real about the Psalms as they give 'voice' to the entire experience of being human: lament, thankfulness, anger, contrition, despair, goodness – you'll find it all there. Often the language used in the Psalms isn't polished or polite, but is earthy and rough, expressing raw, barefaced emotion. David, Asaph and other writers of the Psalms didn't hesitate to bring their thoughts and deepest utterances to God – and then they made these public by turning them into church songs! I am amazed how many of the Psalms start out with lament or despair or anger, and over the course of the Psalm, this is turned to praise and thankfulness before God. There is a lesson to be learned here in this current season of life – to likewise bring our deepest thoughts and angst before God and to let Him transform these in a way that puts God in his rightful place in our lives. I often find that this becomes a springboard for encouraging and building up others around me. So... why have I started this school newsletter this way? Over the past month most of our staff have been sick with either COVID or some other seasonal bug and I know that our staff could do with a boost right now. Would you prayerfully consider helping turn a difficult season into one of thanks by writing a positive card, note or email to your child or young person's teacher(s) or the office staff or caretaker to encourage them and build them up?

Matariki

Friday 24th June 2022 is a public holiday – the first time our nation has collectively recognised and celebrated Matariki. For me a core part of being a Kiwi is understanding and enjoying our Māori cultural traditions. Having spent time in the US, I love the yearly November celebration of ‘Thanksgiving’. Can I suggest that we approach Matariki with this same idea – one of thanksgiving. I would love to see Matariki within our special character context become a tradition where we can embrace and together celebrate the goodness of God; the Lord of our past, present, and future. While we are celebrating Matariki on the 24th June the ‘season’ of Matariki begins much earlier. For Māori, the appearance of Matariki heralds a time of remembrance, joy and peace and is so much more than a single day. It is a time for communities to come together and celebrate. As well as celebrating, this season also aims to help our children learn discernment; to understand the difference between worshipping the Creator God who made all things and loves his creation, and the ‘created things’ themselves.

Matariki refers to the star cluster known in English as the Pleiades that can be found in the winter sky just before dawn. According to pre-eminent scholar on astronomy, Dr Rangi Matamua (Nga Tuhoē) “Matariki – is a time to look at the promise of the new year ahead with all its blessings”. He explains, that there are three elements of Matariki –

The first is reflection; a time to be grateful and in our own way farewell the people that we have lost and be thankful for everything we have received.

Then it’s about celebrating the present with feasting and spending that time to reconnect with one another. It’s not about gift-giving. It’s about sitting down and spending time. Time is the biggest gift ever if you can spend that time to listen to talk with each other.

And the last element is taking time to plan for the future and looking ahead.

New week we are celebrating Matariki here at Cornerstone in a number of ways: the Aroha Team are holding a breakfast on Thursday 23rd, and in our secondary school, we are holding our first ever School Hangi (please see information later in this newsletter). We are going to need some serious help to get this off the ground (literally!!) and so if you can help us with this, please email our Middle School AP, Ian Groube (ian@cornerstone.ac.nz)

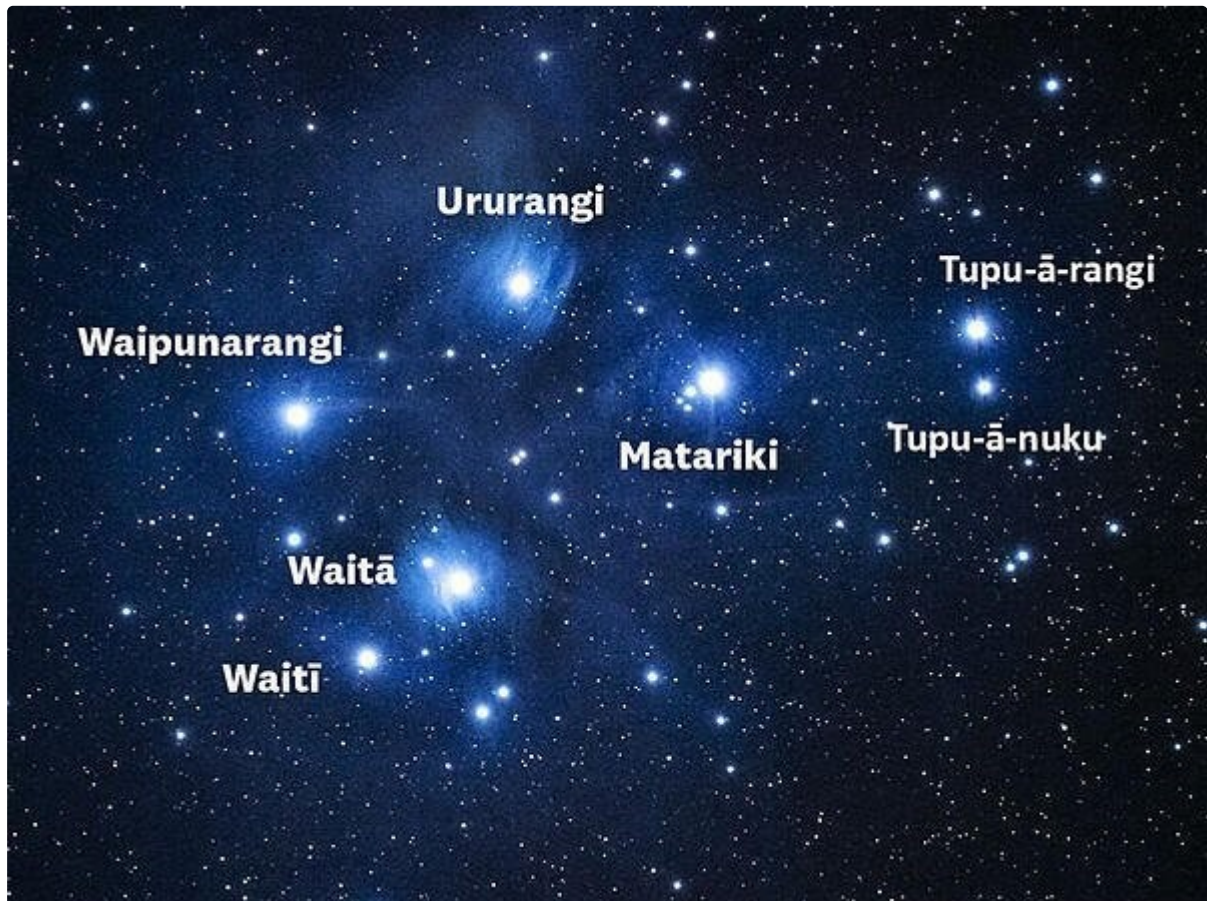
SCHOOL NOTICES
