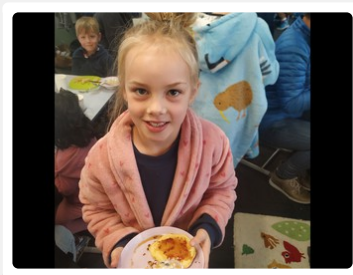

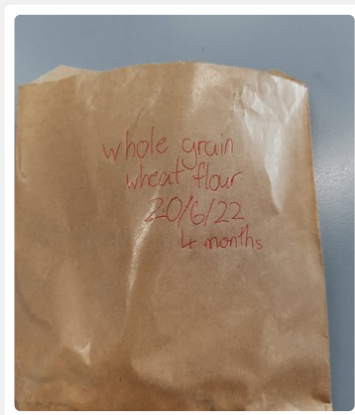

## Year 9 Food Tech and Nutrition

Our Year 9 Food Tech and Nutrition students were surprised to discover a wide variety of grains and made their own wholegrain flour during our last session. We learnt that it's good to eat a variety of grains because each has its own special mixture of vitamins and minerals. We also learnt that whole grains offer a "complete package" of health benefits. All whole grain, as it comes from the farmer after being harvested and cleaned, includes 3 parts: the bran, germ, and endosperm and each part contains precious nutrients. The students classified different grains and then made wholegrain wheat flour with great enthusiasm. 😊 Some took their freshly milled flour home to use in their baking. Well done team. Great teamwork, great discussions during the class.

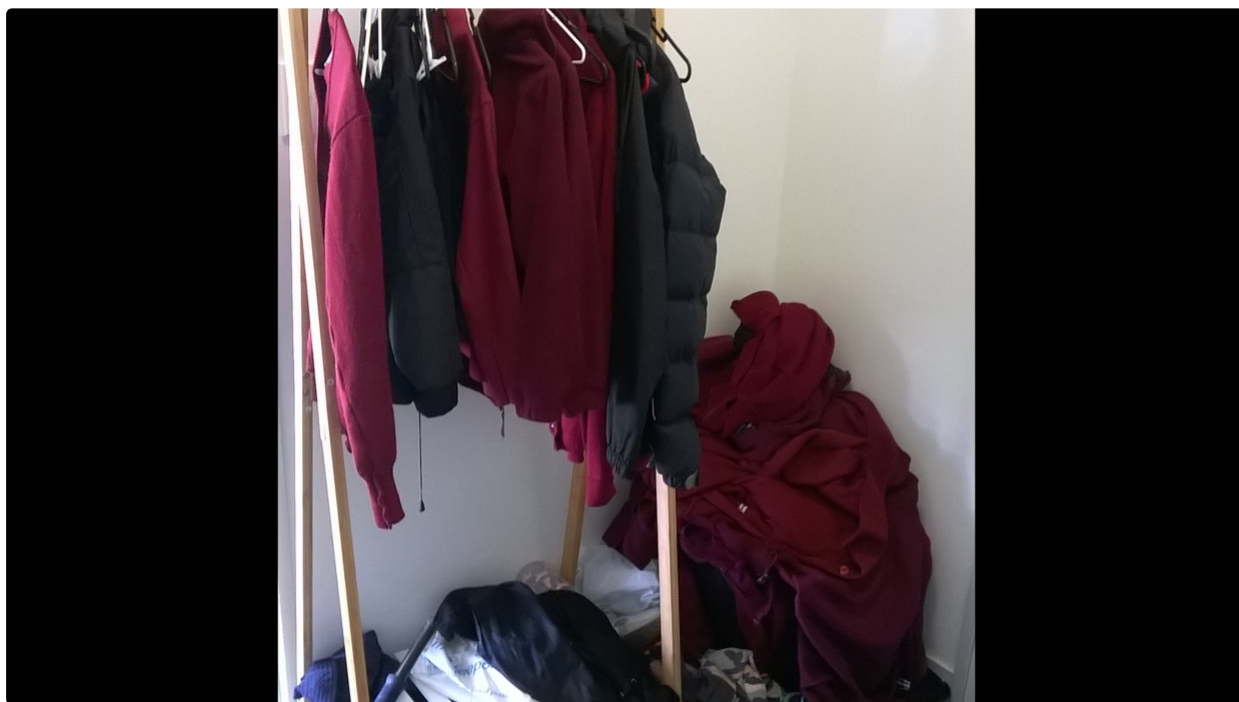


