DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



Dear Parents, Caregivers and Whānau,

Building the Kingdom:

One of the most remarkable aspects of our time at Cornerstone is that we are free to share, discuss and encourage each other with the Gospel message. We know that God's message of love and salvation is just as relevant today as it was 2000 years ago. But did you know that many of our teenagers do not think God's message can apply to them? Today's teenage world has become very complicated.

Matthew 22:36-40 calls us to love...

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbour as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

The instruction to love our neighbour as we love ourselves can sometimes be a real challenge in the lives of our teenagers. For us as adults too. What love is, has been distorted by social media and popculture. Further, the teenager brain <u>craves</u> justice when it is hurt but <u>expects</u> grace when it makes mistakes. Teenagers often see things as either right or wrong and are immensely challenged sometimes by the shades of grey that pervade our world.

On top of this, the world teaches us that there is no one source of truth anymore. That my truth is just as valid as your truth. All of this can lead teenagers to think they are too far gone for God to love them or want them. And that is sad. Helping our teenagers to keep safe and navigate the many mixed messages is vitally important if we are to lead them to God's truth. The truth that He himself created each of us as distinct and with purpose. That He loves us and takes care of us all the days of our lives. That there is no promise that our lives will be easy, but His open arms are available for each of us every day of the week.

Sometimes as parents we lament that our teenagers rebel against the advice and wisdom we share with them. I suspect this is an ageold parent lament. What is different about parenting now though is the technology space. The challenges this space presents can leave us as parents feeling ill-equipped and out of date when trying to relate and keep our children safe.

Rather than giving up, tempting though it is, maybe we can lean on the following basic understanding. The knowledge that what is published online can and does stay online. Part of our job in the parent space is to keep our 30-year-old children safe from their 14year-old selves. When we explain that too them, and that we just want what is safe and best for them, they can see that our motivation is not about depriving them of their fun. Something the teenage brain often concludes.

Please continue, as we do here at school, to encourage our teenagers to keep safe online. Email <u>Paul@cornerstone.ac.nz</u> for advice about setting up device protection and Wi-Fi protection in your home. Talk frequently to your teenagers about issues that are bothering them. Offer grace where it is due, and guidance where it is needed. The truth of the Gospel will always be relevant. It doesn't matter how far gone someone thinks they are, God's open arms and the grace born from the cross will save even the most lost in our world if they only turn to Him. Let's love others as we would want to be loved ourselves.


Digitech Project - Countries Signpost



Anyone! The more, the merrier! They do not need to be associated with the school. What time will it finish (so I can tell my babysitter)?


We hope to be finished with results and wrap up by 10pm or so.
