PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Whānau,

It seems crazy that next week marks the first of December. 'Where has this year gone?' is a common phrase I hear from parents in our school community. This Sunday we begin the first day of the Christian tradition of 'Advent' in the weeks leading up to the birth of Christ at Christmas. Advent—a word derived from a Latin word meaning "arrival," gives us time to reflect on the one who is about to arrive! Immanuel—the immense God who became immensely small; a single cell lying in a poor teen's womb. In Advent we anticipate the arrival of a ruler who will show a different way to rule; one who gently shepherds instead of manipulating through powerplay. In Advent we wait for the child born unto us upon whose shoulders the government will rest; the Prince of Peace in whose kingdom the lion lays down with the lamb. This season of advent is about waiting—a practice I confess I struggle with, but a holy practice I think is healthy as we enter this crazy Christmas silly season!

There are a few key events and reminders I would like to take a moment to outline in this newsletter:

1. Primary Athletics

2. Senior Student Examinations

Next week marks the very last of the Year 11-13 examinations. Please continue to hold our students in your prayers and thank you to so many families I know have been praying faithfully for our students over the past few weeks. We anticipate that most of our year 11 to 13 students will manage to pass NCEA 1,2 and 3 in spite of all of the COVID interruptions. I would like to acknowledge the tireless efforts of our secondary teachers who have literally worked their tails off in the last few weeks to ensure no student gets left behind – thank you!

3. <u>Uniform</u>

Please remember that we have now shifted our School Uniform shop offsite. All parents are to purchase all regulation school uniform items at NZ Uniforms, 589B Tremaine Avenue, Palmerston North. This shop remains open over the Summer Holidays and is also open on Saturdays, 9am till 4pm. I would like to take a moment to express my sincere thanks to Mrs Ilona Shewell, our student administration officer who has run our school uniform shop superbly here at Cornerstone Christian School. Ilona will remain as student admin officer but will have space to pick up a number of other school admin roles now that we have passed responsibility for our uniform to NZ Uniforms Ltd.

4. Prizegiving and the required Uniform for these Events

I would like to formally invite all Cornerstone parents and extended family to our two Cornerstone Christian School Prize-giving ceremonies:

- a. **Primary School End of Year Celebration** Thursday 15th December in the school gymnasium starting at 1.00pm. All students will need to come dressed in their neatest summer school uniform and shoes. We suggest that students do not wear their polar fleece jackets as we anticipate that it will be warm inside the gymnasium. No coloured shoes are to be worn only regulation black roman sandals or leather/leather-look shoes. For more information on our regulation uniform please click here:
- **b. Middle School (year 7-10) and Senior Secondary School Prize-giving** Thursday 15th December in the school gymnasium starting at 6:30pm.

Middle School students will need to come dressed in a clean white regulation school shirt or blouse with regulation school shorts or skirt. Regulation Jerseys or cardigans may be worn if the day is colder. Students are to wear tidy black roman sandals, black leather lace-up/buckle shoes or black leather look sneakers (see photos here) with regulation navy blue opaque tights or regulation navy socks (no other colours are allowed on the shoes or soles, canvas shoes are not permitted). Senior School Students, please wear the regulation school blazer and tie. If students do not own a blazer, then the required uniform is the same as for middle school students (above). The school will be conducting uniform checks of year 7-10 students today and parents will be notified by email or text if a student's uniform is non-compliant or needs sorting out before end of year prize-giving.

On Friday 25th November and Monday 28th November, Kelvin After School Kids will be open for the full days. Please contact Christina for more information and enrolment procedure.



Primary School Aroha Children Being Collected After School


